Finance Update - Maurice Cloutier

I'm writing this update so that our church members and friends can understand the current situation with our church's financial condition. Arlington Street United Methodist Church is struggling to meet our operational expenses to keep the church open. This year we have reduced the Custodian's time, the Administrative Secretary's time, and the Pastor has gone from half time to quarter time effective 7/22/2024. We have reduced our spending as much as is possible currently. In addition to this we have lost our church organist/choir director.

Since June 2024 the Trustees have transferred 0ver \$7,000.00 to the Finance Committee to cover operating expenses of the church. The church is not on a sustainable path to keeping its doors open for very much longer. This situation is dire to say the least. If we do not have the support of our members and friends financially, being actively engaged in attending worship services, and participating in areas of fundraising to alleviate our financial condition, then we have ourselves to blame for the consequences we face soon.

Those members and friends of the church that were there when we needed them, I praise your efforts and your continuous support. The church should be a gathering place to worship, to serve the community, and to provide fellowship to each other. To share in the right to gather as a family of believers who share in each other's joys and concerns. To serve as necessary on committees that need your help and expertise.

We will be holding our Consecration Sunday at the Nov. 24th church service. I truly hope and pray that the congregation/members will be in attendance to show their support of our church who has been serving the community and neighborhood for over 125 years. I want to thank you for having supported our church. I am asking you to continue that support and if possible, perhaps you could give the church a donation to the General Fund.

This year has been extremely stressful for many of us, and I understand that. You are not alone in that situation. I can attest that it has been very stressful for the Finance Committee members as well. I truly appreciate their dedication to the task.

I know some of the readers of this update will be upset with the tone of this message, and for that I apologize. I can't paint a pretty picture at this point, but I am hopeful that the situation will turn around soon if we really put our hearts and minds together to find a solution.

In all the years that I have been associated with Arlington Street United Methodist Church's finances this year, by far, has been the most challenging. The Finance Committee and the Trustee's have been considering some alternatives, that may be taken in the future,

to ensure the viability of this church in the coming years. The Trustees, as recently as October 22nd, have voted on renting the church Parsonage to raise money.

The financial situation the church finds itself in currently is unsustainable and will not end well. The Finance Committee will continue to monitor the situation and by the Grace of God we will find a way to make it through the year financially.

If anyone of our members or friends have any suggestions to help alleviate the situation, we currently find ourselves in, please do not hesitate to contact the Finance Committee. We are all in this together and together we will overcome it!

2024 Greater Nashua Crop Walk

Currently, the SPRC Committee is searching for Lenny's replacement. The Music Accompanist coordinates and implements the music ministry as a form of worship to enhance the spiritual life of Arlington Street United Methodist Church. General duties include.

- (I) Worship Planning and Accompaniment: The Music Accompanist works closely with the Pastor to plan and lead the worship music on Sundays and for special services during the year including Christmas and Easter. The music portion of the worship service typically consists of prelude, hymns, responses, offertory, anthem, and postlude, played on the piano.
- (2) Choir: The Music Accompanist works with the choir to plan and select appropriate selections for the music ministry. The Music Accompanist will accompany the choir during choral music offerings; frequency of choral participation may vary.
